Course Description:

This course emphasizes theoretical and practical aspects of civil litigation in federal and state animal law cases, and administrative matters. With an emphasis on farm animal protection, the course examines all aspects of an animal law case, including jurisdictional prerequisites, complaints, discovery, dispositive motions, hearings, and fees. The course will also address protecting animals' interests through litigation related to enacting and defending citizen initiatives; the use of state and federal environmental, false advertising and unlawful business practice laws; and specific federal statutes such as the Humane Methods of Slaughter Act, the Federal Meat Inspection Act and the Administrative Procedure Act.

Evaluation:

Student grading will be based on A final exam (66%) and class participation (34%). Class attendance and participation are an important component of a successful seminar and students will be expected to be ready to discuss the assigned reading for each session.

The syllabus sets forth the basic reading assignments for class sessions, which may be supplemented each week with additional materials. Exact dates and assignments may change as the course progresses, and there will likely be occasions where the subject from one class will carry over to the next.
