Networking :

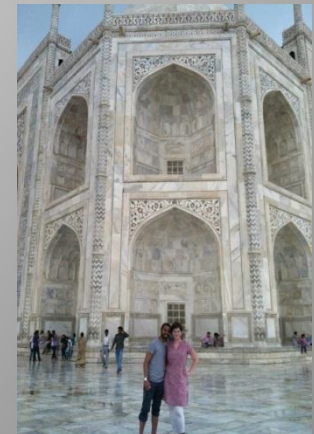
- Opportunity to work with other law students, attorneys, non-profits, etc.

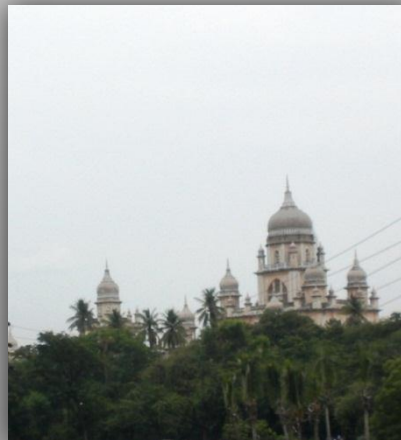
