The National Crime Victim Law Institute (NCVLI) invites you to nominate individuals and/or organizations to receive a 2012 Outstanding Achievement Award. These awards recognize individuals and/or organizations in one of three categories listed at the bottom of this page. NCVLI presents the awards at its annual Crime Victim Law Conference.

PURPOSE

To recognize attorneys, advocates, and organizations that have made significant contributions to the enhancement of crime victims' status and standing within the criminal justice system.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

 The award recipient must be an attorney, advocate, or organization that has demonstrated dedication, leadership, and outstanding achievement in assisting crime victims, enforcing crime victims' rights, and working as a catalyst for positive change in the criminal justice system. Candidates nominated but not selected in previous years are also eligible for consideration. Previous award winners are not eligible. NOMINATION SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- You may nominate an individual, an organization, or a team of individuals or organizations in any of the three categories.
- The description of the nominee's accomplishments should not exceed 500 words and should make clear the nature and significance of the achievement and the nominee's specific role in that achievement.
- 3. You may submit supporting materials, such as a biography or resumé that summarizes the nominee's background and experience. If the nominee is an organization, describe its mission and objectives and provide a brief history of the

organization.

 Please complete a separate nomination form for each individual, organization, or team nominated.

SELECTION PROCESS

NCVLI's award committee reviews the nominations and selects the award recipients.

TERMS OF THE AWARD

Submission of an entry form authorizes NCVLI to publish the award recipient's names, photos, and/or profiles on its website and in promotional materials.
