OREGON LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Oregon's legislative history records are organized by the session year and bill number. Follow the steps below to locate the bill number when all you have is the Oregon Revised Statutes section. Additional links are available at Boley Law Library's Oregon Legal Research page, http://lawlibguides.lclark.edu/Oregon.

STEP 1 Find the Year and Chapter Number in the Oregon Revised Statutes. The bracketed information at the end of each ORS section provides the Oregon Laws chapter numbers. In this example — 1987 is the year this section was enacted, and 1993 the year amended.

Example:	60.301 Requirement for and duties of board of directors.
	 (1) Each corporation shall have a board of directors. (2) All corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the [1987 c.52 s68; 1993 c.403 s4]

Tip: If there is no date at the end of the statute, it was enacted prior to 1953. Ask a librarian for assistance.

STEP 2 Find the Bill Number in Oregon Laws.

Using the ORS section above as an example, you would go to the 1987 volume of *Oregon Laws*. Next look for chapter 52. The house or senate bill number appears in the upper right corner of the legislation, in this case SB 303.

STEP 3 Check if a Legislative Tracing was produced by the State Archives. Tracings show the committees; the dates and page numbers in the minutes that the bill was discussed; and listings of the exhibits and audiotapes, which constitute the verbatim record of discussion. If one is available, you can skip directly to step 5.

STEP 4 Find the House and Senate Committee to which the bill was referred and Dates of Action from the Senate and House Journal.

A) Senate Committee name (e.g., Business, Housing, and Finance)

B) House Committee name (e.g., Consumer and Business Affairs)

C) Dates on which action occurred regarding your bill (e.g., hearings and work sessions)

STEP 5 Find the Minutes and Exhibits.

Now that you have the bill number and the relevant Senate and House committees, you'll want to find the committee minutes in which the bill was discussed and to read the exhibits prepared by the witnesses. Unfortunately, **there are no transcribed committee minutes in Oregon.** Instead, a researcher can either listen to the proceedings on audio and/or read a summary of the minutes, depending on the year.

To determine at what point in the work session or hearing your bill was discussed, use the Committee Minute Summaries on microfilm from 1961 to 2001, and online from 2003 and 2005, and the Audio Log for minutes from 2007-2013, listed below.

In both the microfilm cabinets and online, the Minute Summaries are arranged by year, then by House, Senate, or Joint Committee, then by committee name, with the minutes listed by date of action.

Tip: Check the corresponding minutes reel first, looking for the **Measures and Status Index Table** at the beginning of each committee's records, for help locating the exhibits on the reel.

STEP 6 Find additional Legislative Records Associated with the Bill. Other sources of legislative history include bills, floor proceedings, and staff reports.
