## 3. Dean's plans

## 7. <u>Responsibilities</u>

a. Every representative and board member is responsible to make Amreet (<u>amreet@lclark.edu</u>) aware of their group's meeting schedule. In addition, after every meeting a paragraph summary of issues discussed, expected issues, and next meeting date should be sent to the sba-list. This will help representatives keep current with ongoing issues at the school.

## 8. Bylaw Amendments

- a. <u>Proposed amendments focus on election campaign remedies</u> (18 AYE; 13 NAY)
  - a) Currently, the SBA bylaws allow reprimand and corrective action for failure to conform to election campaign rules. Bylaws II.F.7.e. The change would provide more notice that unsolicited emails on listserves are unallowed during the campaign period.
  - b) The proposed change to the bylaws would amend the section **from**:
    - i) e. Sanctions may include reprimand, required corrective action(s), and disqualification.
  - c) To read: [changes in bold]
    - i) e. Sanctions may include reprimand, required corrective action(s), **deduction** of votes (particularly for email violations) and disqualification.
- b. <u>Revision of the appointment system</u> (Approved without objection.)
  - A proposed change to the appointment system would provide fall elections of nonofficer positions resigned during the Summer. Currently, vacant positions may be filled by SBA President appointment, to be confirmed by the SBA at the following meeting. Bylaws II.D.2.
  - b) The proposed change to the bylaws would amend the section from:
    - i) 2. If a vacancy arises, the President shall appoint a replacement. The replacement shall serve in an interim capacity until confirmed at the next SBA meeting. A simple majority is needed for confirmation. SBA has the discretion to veto the President's choice at the next SBA meeting.
  - c) To read: [changes in bold]
    - i) 2. If a vacancy arises during the Summer and is a non-officer position, the vacancy will be filled during Fall elections. Otherwise, the President shall appoint a replacement. The replacement shall serve in an interim capacity until confirmed at the next SBA meeting. A simple majority is needed for confirmation. SBA has the discretion to veto the President's choice at the next SBA meeting.
- c. Addition and revision of SBA internal committees
  - A. <u>(Tabled; 0 AYE's)</u> Currently all proposed changes to the rules must go through the rules committee. In order to allow individuals to propose changes without a limiting administrative procedure, that practice would be made optional. Bylaws IV.E.1.
  - The proposed change to the bylaws would amend the section from:
    - 1. The Rules Committee shall receive, review, and publicize proposed resolutions and proposed amendments to the Bylaws prior to presentation at the next SBA meeting. All changes to the Bylaws must be approved by a simple majority of SBA members.
  - To read: [changes in bold]

1. At the proposer's election, the Rules Committee shall receive, review, and publicize proposed resolutions and proposed amendments to the Bylaws prior to presentation at the next SBA meeting. All changes to the Bylaws must be approved by a simple majority of SBA members.

• **B.** (Approved; 3 NAY's) Currently there is no standing to committee to review the way we communicate activities and between students, organizations, faculty and administration. I propose the creation of a new committee in the Bylaws at IV.G.

The Communications committee will review the techniques used by students, organizations, faculty, and administration to inform, advertise and schedule activities. They will make recommendations to the SBA once each semester on how to better facilitate campus interaction. d. <u>Addition of requirement to participate in the Student Group Roundtable as a condition of</u> <u>SBA funding</u>

- The continued access to student group funds would become conditional upon meeting twice each semester at Student Group Roundtables. These roundtables would allow each group to inform one another of expected events and coordinate to avoid conflicts insofar as possible.
- e. <u>LRAP student assessment renewal</u> (2 NAYS; Approved without objection to put before student body for vote)

Previously the student government put to vote a student assessment of \$25 per person to help repay loans of low income lawyers. The assessment has helped spur the OSBar and the ABA to work towards a national LRAP. The ABA is currently lobbying for state legislature LRAP's. My recommendation is that we reratify this assessment, but also bring it before the entire student body during the Spring election. Repeated resolutions are more convincing for state legislature.

After this was adopted by the faculty, there was a provision for future reratification by the students. It is up to the SBA to determine whether this should go before the entire student body.

## 1. EVP Amreet Sandhu (Approved without objection)

She has worked in several different student groups and has always taken an active role in evening student advocacy. Hadas has worked hard since her appointment.

## 3. AEP Rep #2 Milos Bosanac (tabled for further discussion)

Resignation of the the 2nd SBA AEP representative left us with one of two representatives to the AEP Committee. Milos Bosanac was among the many volunteers interested in this position. Milos's application showed a strong desire to work for the committee, and he approached the application in multiple ways. As the 3rd student member of the AEP Committee, Milos brings experience with California's minority communities. Milos has talked to several students and the AEP committee head in order to better represent on the AEP committee.

j. Prime Parking Issue Discussion (approved without objection to monitor situation)

There is a request to explore whether the student parking fills before 6pm. It has been suggested we review the parking for a week or two to determine if the current number of students allowed in the nearby parking lot is appropriate.
