Several of Trump's cabinet members have come under scrutiny for scandals that raise serious ethical concerns. Recent news coverage has elucidated issues ranging from EPA Administrator Scott Pruitt's sweetheart rental arrangement with a fossil fuel lobbyist, to Secretary of the Interior Ryan Zinke's government-funded travel expenses to attend meetings with donors, and Secretary of Energy Rick Perry's agenda secretly provided to him by an energy company. Imagine these and other members of the Trump Administration's environmental and energy agencies were licensed lawyers in Oregon. Would any of their actions raise ethical concerns under Oregon law? If so, which ones? What remedies are available, if any? If not, what does that say about Oregon's ethics rules?

# "Environmental Law Under Trump" Symposium on April 6 Illuminated Impact of Trump Administration Policies and Rollbacks

President Trump is reshaping environmental law and policy. From withdrawing from the Paris climate accord and slashing the Environmental Protection Agency's budget, to threats to reverse the national monument status for certain public lands, Trump's presidency foreshadows drastic changes in the role of the federal government in

addressing pressing environmental challenges. Lewis & Clark Law School's "Environmental Law Under

Trump'' symposium on April 6 brought together academics, practitioners, concerned citizens, and students to discuss the impact of the administration on laws related to public lands, pollution, climate and air quality, and biodiversity. The symposium panels included both law professors and practitioners from around the country.
