
Thank You for Joining Us at Tomorrow's Energy System

Green Energy Institute Testifies to Promote the Successful Implementation of PURPA in Oregon

On January 31, GEI director Melissa Powers presented testimony to the Oregon Public Utility Commission (PUC) to discuss the most successful means for implementing the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act (PURPA) in Oregon. GEI argued that technology and experience are pushing continual improvements in



renewable energy production and efficiency, and Oregon's PURPA policies should encourage and capture these advancements. Furthermore, PURPA policies should focus on decreasing transactional costs, strategically using existing transmission infrastructure, ensuring fair transmission access, and encouraging the implementation of more efficient technologies in new and existing projects.
