To qualify for an Energy, Innovation and Sustainability Law Certificate, among other things, a student must write one substantial paper "on an energy law topic that related to energy or on a topic that combines energy law and business law concepts." This form is to certify that the student has written the required paper.

While the determination of what constitutes a "substantial" paper lies in the judgment of the faculty member, ordinarily a paper in a course that counts for more than half the course grade would probably be a "substantial" paper.

It is presumed that papers in energy law courses or energy and business/sustainability courses (see What's What) would be on "energy or energy/business law topics." In other courses or in independent study, paper topics also may be on energy law issues. Generally, the concept of energy, innovation and sustainability law has been broadly construed, but in case of doubt advice can be sought from the environmental law faculty.
