

## TO ENSURE NO PERSON IS FORCED TO FOREGO A BASIC NEED, PAD IS DEDICATING OCTOBER TO MENSTRUAL JUSTICE

We all know that the combined impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, recent wildfires, and nightly protests have taken a severe toll on many of us this year; however, it is undeniable that the ramifications felt by our homeless neighbors are even more extreme.

The Lewellyn Chapter of Phi Alpha Delta—the largest co-ed legal fraternity in the world—is particularly concerned that the homeless residents of our city are consistently denied their human right to menstrual hygiene.

Some local nonprofits serving the houseless even reported distributing four times more condoms

than menstrual hygiene products since the pandemic began in March!

To ensure that no person is forced to forego this basic need, we have decided to dedicate the month of October to menstrual justice. Specifically, our chapter is collecting monetary donations that will fund the purchase and disbursement of these essential products in partnership with local menstrual justice and homeless services organizations.

If you believe in the right to menstrual hygiene or want to help support our homeless neighbors, we ask that you please donate whatever you can to our Venmo (Daniel-Moltke) or Paypal (phialphadelta@lclark.edu).

#### **EASY QUICK-PICKLE**

A basic no-cook refrigerator method, and a great way to use odds & ends instead of composting!

#### **CONTAINER + FOOD + WATER, VINEGAR, SALT + SHAKE = DONE**

#### Required Items

- one nonmetallic pickling/storage container
- unflavored salt (Kosher/pickling) recommended, but any will do)
- plain white vinegar (amount varies by how much you wish to pickle, but enough to cover/submerge your food items in the pickling/storage container)
- water (amount equivalent to the amount of vinegar)
- food items for pickling can be all of one type or varied

#### Steps

- Place items for pickling into anything nonmetallic you wish to use as a pickling/storage container.
- Add equal amounts of water and vinegar until items are covered, then add the appropriate amount of salt.
- Stir, or if using a lid, shake to mix. Once the container contents are room temperature, move to the refrigerator.

#### Notes:

- For sweeter pickles, with every measure of salt use the same measure of granulated white sugar (or equivalent substitute) and add at the same time as the salt.
- "Done" after 24hrs, but the longer items pickle the better.
- Keep items refrigerated, in the pickling liquid, and use within a month or so.
