Rules

1. Teams and Registration

- a. Team size is a minimum of 2, and a maximum of 5.
- b. Each team must include at least one Lewis and Clark Law Student or faculty member. Friends, family, or non-law students may participate.
- c. Due to budgetary restrictions, prizes can only be provided to law students. If a winning team has a non-law student, it will be that team's responsibility to distribute the prize as they see fit.
- d. Teams must register by 11:00 pm October 29th to compete.
- e. Registration requires the names of each individual on the team, a single phone number that will be used to send and receive texts during the hunt, a single email that will be used during the hunt, and a **signed waiver** from each participant.
- f. Non-law students will be required to submit a signed waiver, and children of who are participating will be required to have a signed waiver submitted by their parent or legal guardian.
- g. Teams competing with a member who did not submit a signed waiver to Cole by the October 29th deadline will be disqualified.

2. Competitions

- a. Scavenger Hunt:
 - Each team will be given a total of 5 riddles, the first at 6:00PM on October 31st. This first riddle will be provided by email to ensure a simultaneous start for every team. Teams may physically start the hunt wherever they like.
 - ii. Each riddle will include the category of the location, the quadrant of Portland that the location is within, and the riddle. Keep in mind that quadrants of Portland are split North and South by Burnside, and East and West by the Willamette. The difference between NW and SW could be a walk across the street.
 - iii. If students are unable to solve the riddle after 20 minutes, and admit that their knowledge of the downtown Portland area is flawed, they may ask for a hint.

- iv. Once the team has solved the riddle and found the answer, they must travel to the location and take a selfie with their team in front of the location. They must make the best effort to include all team members in the selfie to verify the team has not split up. They will then email that photo to the organizer, (cdowney@lclark.edu), who will confirm they have solved the riddle, are at the correct location, and then provide them with the next riddle.
- v. Including the first riddle, each team will solve 5 riddles and visit 5 locations. Prizes will be provided to the 4 teams who finish the fastest. The winners will be announced at the after party.

b. Costume Competitions:

- i. In addition to the Scavenger Hunt competition, prizes will be provided to a winner and a runner up in each of the categories below.
 - 1. Scariest Costume
 - 2. Funniest Costume
 - 3. Best in Show (Best All Around)
- ii. The Costume Competitions can be entered either in the form of a team, or as an individual, but not both. Prizes won by more than one person are split among those persons. For example: Jack and Jordan have a couples costume. They submit it for the competition to be considered in every category. Jack and Jordan win first place for scariest costume. They share the prize between them. Neither Jack or Jordan can enter their costumes to be considered individually.
- iii. Costumes cannot win in more than one category (Funniest, Scary, Best in Show).
- Students will email Cole Downey (<u>cdowney@lclark.edu</u>) with a picture of their costume the evening of the scavenger hunt, with a deadline of 7pm, October 31st.
- v. Costumes will be judged by the VP of Programming's Student Life committee.

3. Prizes

a. Scavenger Hunt Prizes

- i. 1st Place Finisher for Scavenger Hunt: \$200
- ii. 2nd Place Finisher for Scavenger Hunt: \$150
- iii. 3rd Place Finisher for Scavenger Hunt: \$100
- iv. 4th Place Finisher for Scavenger Hunt: \$50

b. Costume Competitions Prizes

- i. Scariest Costume
 - 1. 1st Place: \$100
 - 2. 2nd Place: \$50
- ii. Funniest Costume

- 1. 1st Place: \$100
- **2.** 2nd Place: \$50

iii. Best In Show (Best All Around)

- **1.** 1st Place: \$100
- **2.** 2nd Place: \$50

4. Safety Precautions

a. COVID Safety Measures:

We're hosting an event that gets you outside and gives you an opportunity to see your friends. However, it is vital that we all continue to observe the important safety measures associated with this activity. Any team with members who lack the necessary respect for these safety measures will be disqualified immediately. We are stepping out into the community while representing L&C Law.

i. Masks: Masks are required in all public spaces and in any instance where you are nearby an individual with whom you have not been isolated during COVID-19.

b. Sober Driving

This event will more than likely involve your team driving between locations, unless you elect to take some other form of transportation. Any member of the team who drives will be completely sober and unimpaired, partaking in no drinking or other substance usage before or during the event. We trust that if you and your teammates choose to partake in any substances after you have finished the scavenger hunt, you will only do so after having organized safe transportation home.
