## No Duty to Protect From 3d Persons

- 1. Basic Rule— $\partial$  owes no duty to  $\pi$  respecting acts of 3d persons regardless of whether the  $\partial$ 's conduct creates a risk (i.e., constitutes misfeasance or nonfeasance)
- 2. Exceptions
  - a. Statutorily imposed duty
  - b. Special relationships
    - i. Between  $\partial$  and  $\pi$ 
      - a. See list from handout on nonfeasance
    - ii. Between  $\partial$  and the 3d Person (i.e., the other tortfeasor)
      - a. Employer–employee w/facilitation
      - b. Custodian-ward
      - c. Parent-dependent, minor child
      - d. Mental health professional-patient
  - c.  $\partial$  has made certain promises
  - d. Commercial vendors of alcohol for on-premises consumption where patron noticeably intoxicated
