The National Crime Victim Law Institute (NCVLI) invites you to nominate individuals and/or organizations to receive a **2021 Outstanding Achievement Award.** These awards recognize individuals and/or organizations in one of three categories.

PURPOSE

To recognize attorneys, advocates, and organizations that have made significant contributions to the enhancement of crime victims' status and standing within the justice system.

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

- The award recipient must have demonstrated dedication, leadership, and outstanding achievement in assisting crime victims with their rights, and working as a catalyst for positive change in the justice system.
- 2. Candidates nominated but not selected in previous years are also eligible for consideration.

3. Self-nominations by the Board or staff of an agency are accepted.

NOMINATION SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- You may nominate an individual, an organization, or a team of individuals or organizations in any of the five categories.
- The description of the nominee's accomplishments should not exceed 500 words and should make clear the nature and significance of the achievement and the nominee's specific role in that achievement.
- 3. You may submit supporting materials, such as a biography or resumé that summarizes the nominee's background and experience. If the nominee is an organization, describe its mission and objectives and provide a brief history of the organization.

4. Please complete a separate nomination form for each individual, organization, or team nominated.

SELECTION PROCESS

NCVLI's award committee reviews the nominations and selects the award recipients. Notifications of selection will occur by mid-October 2021.

TERMS OF THE AWARD

Acceptance of an award authorizes NCVLI to publish the award recipient's names, photos, and/or profiles on its website and in promotional materials.

LEGAL ADVOCACY AWARD

This award recognizes crime victims' rights attorneys who have dedicated and committed their time to representing victims of crime in the criminal justice system.
