LEO LEVENSON AWARD

Leo Levenson Award

Leo Levenson (1903–1981), distinguished attorney and Oregon State Bar member for 56 years, was a highly respected instructor with the law school for many years. The award in his name honors excellence in teaching. It is presented annually to a faculty member selected by the graduating class.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Earl Blumenauer BA '70, JD '76 (D) is the U.S. Representative for Oregon's Third Congressional District. A lifelong resident of Portland, he was raised in the southeastern part of the city and attended Centennial High School. While still an undergraduate student at Lewis & Clark College, he led the state campaign to lower the voting age. Just two years later, Blumenauer was elected to the Oregon legislature, where he served during landmark sessions for tax reform, school funding, ethics reform, and Oregon's groundbreaking environmental and land use laws. During this time, he also earned his JD at Lewis & Clark Law School.

In 1978, Blumenauer was elected to the Multnomah County Commission, where he served for eight years before being elected to the Portland City Council. His 10-year tenure as Commissioner of Public Works focused on the implementation of creative transportation, planning, and environmental programs.

Since his election to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1996, Blumenauer has served Oregon's Third Congressional District without interruption. He is recognized for his innovative policies and political leadership in Oregon and nationwide. Currently a member of the Ways and Means Committee, the chair of the Subcommittee on Trade, and a member of the Subcommittee on Health, Blumenauer's priorities are universal health care and the Green New Deal. He states that his other top concerns are rebuilding and renewing U.S. infrastructure, economic security for families, housing as a human right, protection of public lands, stopping gun violence, ending the prohibition of marijuana, and criminal justice reform.

REGALIA

Academic Costume

The tradition of academic dress began several centuries ago in chilly universities where cap and gown and hood were needed for covering and warmth. Subsequently this has become a ceremonial costume with certain standardized features.

Sleeves in the bachelor's gown are pointed; in the master's gown, oblong with arms projecting at the elbow; in the doctor's gown, bell-shaped. Students receiving the master of studies in law degree wear classic solid black gowns. The doctor's gown and the LLM gown are faced with velvet with three matching stripes on the sleeves, and the hood is lined with the official colors of the degree-conferring institution. For Lewis & Clark these are black and orange. The outside trimming of the hood signifies the discipline in which the degree was conferred, with purple representing a law degree.

Decorations

Those members of the class receiving the LLM degree wear gold cord. Those receiving the master of studies in law degree wear dark green cord.

Students wearing silver cord have earned Latin honors. Members of the Cornelius Honor Society wear purple cord. Those who have earned Community Service honors wear royal blue cord. Students who have earned Pro Bono honors wear light blue cord. Members of the Phi Delta Phi international honor society wear cord of red and light blue.

Members of the class who served on the Animal Law Review wear cord of purple and forest green. Those who served on the Environmental Law Review wear cord of green and white. Students who served on the Lewis & Clark Law Review wear cord of black and orange.

Veterans and members of the U.S. Armed Forces wear cord of red, white, and blue.

Graduates also may wear cords or stoles representing their academic focus, affiliations, and activities.

Mace

The Lewis & Clark ceremonial mace emphasizes the convergence of diverse cultures. It evokes the maces of Europe, medieval symbols of authority that still feature in the proceedings of many governing bodies, and the speaker's staffs of the Northwest Indians, which historically had a similar significance.

The Lewis & Clark mace was carved for Lewis & Clark College by Bill Holm, former curator of Northwest Coast Indian art at the Thomas Burke Memorial Museum in Seattle. In the form of a chieftain's staff, it is a reminder of the history of the Northwest. At the base is a frog representing the primordial beginnings of humanity. The shell-studded space above the frog is symbolic of the passing eons from the beginnings of life in the Northwest to the first human, represented by the Native American. The Hudson's Bay Company and the historic fur trade period—the territorial days of the state of Oregon—are symbolized by the beaver. Crowning the ceremonial staff is the eagle, universal symbol of strength and power, which represents the eventual destiny of the region as part of the United States.

A HISTORY OF THE LAW SCHOOL

Lewis & Clark Law School has its earliest roots in the University of Oregon's original law department, founded in 1884. Thirty-one years later, Dean Calvin U. Gantenbein—declining to relocate the program from downtown Portland to Eugene—led the faculty, administration, and students of the department to form the independent Northwestern College of Law. The 2015–16 academic year marked the centennial of that pivotal event.

After a half century of dedicated leadership by the Gantenbein family, the Northwestern College of Law merged with Lewis & Clark in 1965 and took on its current official name: the Northwestern School of Law of Lewis & Clark College. Soon after, the law school moved to its present location.

Once exclusively a night program, the law school began expanding its offerings in 1970 to include an extensive range of daytime classes. During the subsequent decade, Lewis & Clark Law School, always a highly respected regional institution, rose to a position of national prominence and was recognized for its distinguished legal education, research, and service.

Members of the Class of 2021 join almost 10,000 graduates—among them seven state Supreme Court justices, Federal District Court judges, Oregon's current governor, and scores of trial judges, legislators, and distinguished practitioners in public service and private practice—who enrich the legal community throughout Oregon, the Pacific Northwest, and the nation. The law school shares the excitement of today's graduates as they move into the future.
