Library Access

As a law school graduate, you are normally welcome to use the Law Library during the same hours as students. Although the study rooms are reserved for student use, when the library is open you may use them during the summer while studying for the Bar Exam. During the pandemic, we may need to limit any alumni access to Bar study only. We are also offering Zoom group study rooms to help alumni with their Bar study. Research Services

Lifetime Borrowing Privileges

Law school alumni have lifetime borrowing privileges. As a graduate of the law school, you may check out regularly circulating library materials from Boley. Be sure to get your Lewis & Clark Law School Alumni card from the Alumni office. The first time you check out materials as a graduate you will need to show your Alumni card and update your library record.

Databases (On Campus)

The Library subscribes to several online legal research databases that are free when accessed on campus. Among these are BarBooks, Fastcase, HeinOnline, and ProQuest.

Databases (Off Campus)

Bloomberg, Lexis, and Westlaw all provide access to recent graduates for six months after graduation. The latest details are online at <https://bit.ly/3lI6m76>.

HeinOnline is available to anyone with a Washington County Cooperative Library Services (WCCLS) library card. More information is available at www.wccls.org/research/heinonline. And be sure to check your local [County Law Library](#) for remote database access.

Email accounts for May graduates will remain valid for more than a year following graduation, i.e., through August of the following year.
