For those applicants with a degree in a related field, or a minor in art, additional information is often needed to insure that sufficient foundation knowledge has been attained. In either case, our MAT program will build on and enhance the content knowledge you bring to the work of teaching. To assist us in this endeavor, all Art applicants need to briefly address how the work you have done in your college coursework as well as your experiences beyond the classroom have supported your art content knowledge. We are not asking you to restate your transcript and resume, but rather to highlight experiences that will add detail to your transcript and resume.

Below is a list of art content areas and select disciplinary domains. We ask that all applicants complete all areas of this form:

1. Rate your level of experience on a scale of 1-5 (1 = little or no experience and 5 = highly experienced.)

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2. Indicate under the "Evidence" column where and how you received this experience (coursework, employment, personal research). For all coursework, please list the course (i.e., Drawing I, Intro to Painting, Early East Asian Art). Feel free to attach additional sheets if necessary or recreate this document in order to type your responses.
