Program Design:

In cooperation with CET,
Lewis & Clark offers a
semester or a full-year
program at the Harbin
Institute of Technology.
Study focuses on language
immersion in cultural,
literary, historical and socio-
political contexts. Housing is
in college dormitories.
Independent study trips to
other sites in China, as well
as excursions to historical
sites of interest in and near
Harbin enhance the students'
understanding of life in
contemporary China.
This program is designed to
accommodate high
intermediate and advanced
students. The program's one-

on-one and one-on-two
instruction, combined with
small classes, provide
students with a unique,
personalized curriculum. All
students live with Chinese
roommates and abide by a
Chinese-only language
pledge. With few English-
speaking foreigners, Harbin's
environment provides
wonderful opportunities for
immersion.

Full Year Participation:

If you are participating for a
full year in China, the
January Term in Beijing is
mandatory. This is an
intensive program for
intermediate and advanced
students, which prepares
students to continue to either
Beijing or Harbin after fall
participation at either Guilin
or Beijing.

Requirements Fulfilled:

Fulfills the overseas study
requirement for the East
Asian Studies major, and the
overseas requirement for the
Foreign Language major
(with Chinese as primary
language), and the Chinese
minor.
